#### About DOE Home Energy Rebates

Through the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), the Department of Energy received **\$8.8 billion** to develop two home energy rebate programs: the Home Efficiency Rebate (HER) program and the Home Electrification and Appliance Rebate (HEAR) program. Both rebate programs will be administered by State Energy Offices (SEO) with the goal of increasing disadvantaged household's energy efficiency, lowering utility bills, and reducing carbon emissions.

Funding has been allocated to each state to implement the rebate programs and federal guidance requires SEOs to allocate 40% of state rebate funding to low-income households and an additional 10% to low-income multifamily households. SEOs are required to submit an application to DOEE to receive rebate funds and applications must include a Community Benefits Plan and Education and Outreach Strategy. The deadline for states to apply is January 31, 2025.

The following rebates are available for **single-family homes** with household income **below 80% AMI** and in **multifamily buildings** where **at least 50%** of households have incomes **below 80% AMI**:



Maximum rebate amounts for eligible HEAR measures include:

Heat pump water heater	Up to \$1,750/appliance
Heat pump for space heating or cooling	Up to \$8,000/appliance
Electric stove, cooktop, range, or oven	Up to \$840/appliance
Electric heat pump dryer	Up to \$840/appliance
Electric load service center upgrade	Up to \$4,000
Insulation, air sealing, and ventilation	Up to \$1,600
Electric wiring	Up to \$2,500

*Program Description:* Maine plans to prioritize 50% of HER funds for larger multifamily buildings that are electrifying their heating systems, benefiting approximately 2,250 units. Maine also plans to allocate 30% of HEAR funds to new construction multifamily and manufactured housing, with approximately 1,700 households benefiting from this program. HEAR funds will first go to households at or below 80% AMI and focus on heat pump upgrades for whole-home heating, and the necessary electric panel and electrical wiring upgrades. Rebates could be available in Maine as early as this summer. \*

Program Description: Maryland anticipates rebates will be available during the second half of 2024.

#### Massachusetts

*Program Description:* The Department expects rebates to be available in the fall of 2024 and rebate funding will leverage existing state and federal opportunities, like Mass Save. DOER also plans to expand existing affordable housing decarbonization programs by funding additional measures, targeting decarbonization in existing income restricted multi-family units, leveraging multiple funding sources outside of HER, and exceeding max rebate limits to achieve greater energy savings for low-income units. \*

The state's HER application also increases maximum eligible projects costs for 80 AMI households to \$8,000 if achieving at least 20% energy savings and \$10,000 if achieving at least 35% energy savings. \*
